GREYWACKE BOTRYTIS PINOT GRIS 2018

'This lovely dessert wine was made from shrivelled grapes, hand-harvested in the Brancott Valley and near Renwick, and fermented in an even split of tanks and old French oak barriques. Golden, with a honeyed bouquet, it is fleshy and complex, with lush, peachy, honeysweet flavours, balanced acidity and a slightly oily richness.' **98 Points, Michael Cooper, WINESTATE MAGAZINE**

'Full, bright yellow colour, fresh looking for its age, and the bouquet is superbly fresh and vibrant, with creamy, beeswax and floral fruit evident with good intensity. 'Luscious apricot and black fig, with exotic spice and dried orange peel. Tastes sweeter than the 105g/L residual sugar suggests, but in harmony with its acidity.'

'Around 50% of the fruit is wild-fermented in old barrels, giving additional richness and complexity to the waxy, honeyed lanolin scents and viscous apricot, orange and sweet citrus flavours. 'A lovely mix of bergamot, lychee and dried apricot...Like the other botrytis wines from Greywacke, it's not overdone or crazy sweet, but strikes a fine balance between sugar, fruit and acidity. Medium-bodied, with a silky feel and a lingering, sweet finish, it would be a terrific partner with blue cheeses.'

GREYWACKE BOTRYTIS PINOT GRIS 2013

'Gorgeously luscious aroma of apricots and dried pears. Viscously mouth-filling and with terrific intensity of dried pear and fresh apricot, the aroma matched perfectly on the palate. 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GREYWACKE BOTRYTIS PINOT GRIS 2011
